



Claire Myers Owens Doctoral Level Travel and Research Award

The School of Arts and Humanities at The University of Texas at Dallas is pleased to announce the Claire Myers Owens Travel and Research Award. Drs. Miriam Kalman Friedman BA'80, MA'85, PhD'97 and Robert H. Friedman established this award to honor Claire Myers Owens (1896-1983). The award will assist qualified doctoral students with travel expenses to professional conferences or travel expenses to archives and/or places of interest relevant to their doctoral research.

Award Amount **\$500 for one doctoral student in Humanities**

Deadlines

Conference travel scheduled for the 2012 calendar year is eligible for consideration.

Submission deadline is **March 15, 2012**.

All materials should be submitted to Professor Tim Redman via email, redman@utdallas.edu

Selection period is **April 1-15, 2012**.

Evaluation Criteria

Decisions will be based on:

1. Originality of idea
2. Interesting person, event or theme
3. Compelling articulation of proposal
4. Feasibility of completion

Requirements of Award Holders

- A **final written report** of the project is expected on completion of the awards winner's use of the funds, preferably in the format presented at the conference.

The award nomination and selection process is administered by the School of Arts and Humanities. Applications are vetted and reviewed by Timothy Redman, PhD, and a committee consisting of two other Arts and Humanities faculty members. Awardee will be notified by Professor Redman via email. Awardee is not eligible for any other additional travel awards through the Dean's office for the current calendar year.

This award is not a scholarship or fellowship as you do not have to use the prize for your education; as such the entire award amount is taxable. This will not impact the student's financial aid and will not go towards any amount owed to UT Dallas, but will be taxed. Student awards will go through Accounts Payable and an IRS Form 1099 will be issued to the awardee. If a nonresident alien receives an award and has never met with UT Dallas' Tax Compliance department, they will be required to do so. The Tax Compliance department will figure the required taxation before sending on to Procurement.
