How will joining a sorority or fraternity affect my student academically?

Your student's academic success is important to the sorority and fraternity community. All organizations have specific grade point requirements for new members, as well as minimum grade standards for remaining a member in good standing.

What is the cost of membership?

Cost of membership varies among the groups but does not add measurably to the cost of campus life. All chapters are supported by membership. Typically, the first semester is more costly for incoming members as some one-time fees apply such as new member and initiation fees.

What about the use of controlled substances and alcohol, irresponsible behavior and hazing?

Every Greek organization expects its members to obey all campus, local, state and federal laws and to abide by the sorority or fraternity policies, guidelines and standards.

Organizations allocate significant resources to educate their members about alcohol and substance abuse. Additionally, hazing is illegal in Texas and is not tolerated by FSL, the University or National/International Headquarters.

Responsibilities

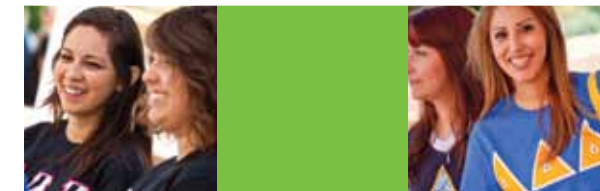
Fraternities and sororities at UT Dallas are held to a high standard and are governed by policies of one of four councils in which they hold membership, along with the policies of the Fraternity and Sorority Life office and the organization's Inter/National headquarters.

Greek Terminology

- Bid** - A formal invitation of membership in a fraternity or sorority
- Chapter** - the individual campus units that are part of an inter/national organization
- Initiation** - the formal ritual ceremony in which a new member takes final vows for full membership
- New Member** - a student who has accepted the bid of a fraternity or sorority
- Recruitment** - the selection process during which potential new members/chapter members get to know each other
- Membership Intake** - the process for joining a National Pan-Hellenic and United Greek Council organization
