Biographical Sketch

Depicted by authors Darwin Payne and Kathy Fitzpatrick in their book *From Prairie to Planes* as Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport's "most visible spokesperson," Joseph M. Dealey Jr. guided the airport's public affairs for fifteen years and was instrumental in the airport's silver anniversary celebration on September 22, 1998. Serving from 1984-1999 as a public information specialist and ultimately the airport's Director of Public Affairs, Dealey was directly involved in many important milestones of the growth and development of one of the nation's largest and most significant airports. During his tenure, Dealey successfully dealt with several major challenges that threatened the airport's operations and growth. The airport experienced two major airline crashes: the August 2, 1985 crash of Delta flight 191 while on a normal approach to the airport, and the August 31, 1988 crash of Delta flight 1141 while on take-off. Dealey's management of the airport's public response to these tragedies became the textbook methodology for handling future incidents of a similar nature. Throughout its history, the story of commercial aviation in north Texas has been dominated by the desire of the Dallas and Fort Worth communities to establish their primacy as the leader in commercial aviation. The competition between Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport and Dallas Love Field gained national attention through legislation known as the Wright Amendment (which limited the growth potential of Love Field) during Dealey's service as Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport's Director of Public Affairs. Dealey was active in thwarting efforts to repeal this legislation and was instrumental in the continued success of the airport to retain its dominance as the region's most significant international airport.

Born December 1, 1947, Joseph M. Dealey, Jr. represents the fourth generation of the prominent Dealey family, recognized for its leadership and contributions to the growth and development of Dallas, Texas. Dealey Plaza, a National Historic Landmark District since 1993, was named in honor of George Bannerman Dealey, Joe's great-grandfather, who was instrumental in the commercial and civic development of that Dallas site.

In 1970, following his graduation from Trinity University, San Antonio, Texas, Joseph M. Dealey Jr.'s lineage of prominent newspaper and publishing magnates led to the beginning of his first career in the newspaper and publishing business. There he worked in employee relations and later, after service in the Army, entered the Dallas Morning News' management training program in 1972. He ultimately served as vice president of the newspaper's parent, A.H. Belo Corporation. Becoming more involved in the newspaper's executive matters rather than the editorial component of the business which had been his preference, he left the business in 1983. However, his management skills and media acumen served him well as he soon became involved with Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport. Since leaving his position at Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport, Joseph M. Dealey, Jr. has established a communications consulting business in Dallas and has an interest in an independent film company in New York. He remains active in community service and is the recipient of several noteworthy awards and citations. He currently serves as an active member of the Advisory Council of the History of Aviation Collection, Special Collections, McDermott Library, The University of Texas at Dallas.

Joseph M. Dealey, Jr. resides in Dallas, Texas, is married, and has four children.

Scope and Content

The collection contains both archival material and artifacts collected by Joseph M. Dealey, Jr., primarily during his tenure as a Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport executive. The Joe M. Dealey, Jr. Collection is housed in thirty boxes of varying sizes and one framed print on display totaling 37.81 linear feet.

The collection was received in increments on various dates, in no established order. During processing of the collection, seven series were identified, the first six consisting of archival documents and materials and the seventh consisting of artifacts.

The first series, Personal Papers, is organized into two subseries: 1. Joseph M. Dealey, Jr. and 2. Edward M. "Ted" Dealey.

Subseries 1. contains documents attributed to Joseph M. Dealey, Jr.

Subseries 2. contains documents attributed to Edward M. "Ted" Dealey.

The second series, Manuscripts, contains Edward M. "Ted" Dealey's manuscript for *The Last Fool Flight* and the published form of that manuscript as it appeared in *The Southwestern Historical Quarterly* in July 1959.

Series three, Documents, is organized into two subseries: 1. Airlines and 2. Miscellaneous.

Subseries 1. contains passenger-oriented literature and memorabilia published by various airlines.

Subseries 2. contains documents and literature depicting events and places not pertaining to specific airlines.

The fourth series, Images, is organized into five subseries: 1. Calendars, 2. Electronic Media, 3. Photographs, 4. Photographs, Oversize, and 5. Posters and Artwork.

Subseries 1. contains wall calendars with airline (Pan Am) and aviation illustrations.

Subseries 2. contains VHS videotapes depicting various aviation-related topics.

Subseries 3. contains photographs arranged by topic: aircraft, missiles, and personalities.

Subseries 4. contains oversize, framed color photographs depicting historic events at Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport.

Subseries 5. contains wall-size posters depicting various topics and artwork, both framed and unframed, including two storefront window posters depicting *First Flight Travelogs of the Air* by Clara Adams and *The Legend Begins* print captioned and signed by the artist Roy Grinnell and A.V.G. "Flying Tigers" pilots.

The fifth series, Philately, is organized into two subseries: 1. Covers and Envelopes and 2. Stamps.

Subseries 1. contains covers commemorating historic aviation events and an envelope from the Civil Aeronautics Administration.

Subseries 2. contains individual commemorative stamps, sheets of commemorative stamps, and framed and unframed sets of the Classic American Aircraft series of U.S. postage stamps.

Series six, Publications, is organized into six subseries: 1. Booklets, 2. Charts, 3. Folders, 4. Newsletters, 5. Newspapers, and 6. Periodicals.

Subseries 1. contains booklets depicting aviation-related topics.

Subseries 2. contains flying charts for use by pilots.

Subseries 3. contains the folder, "Citizens Shelter Instructions."

Subseries 4. contains issues of the *A&NC Times* and *Braniff B-Liner* newsletters.

Subseries 5. contains clippings and whole newspapers, each of which depicts an historic aviation/space milestone.

Subseries 6. contains clippings and whole issues of aviation and non-aviation periodicals.

The seventh and final series, Artifacts, is organized into six subseries: 1. Airlines, 2. Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport, 3. Miscellaneous, Aviation Related, 4. Miscellaneous, Non-Aviation Related, 5. Models, and 6. Personal Memorabilia.

The materials in this collection are in good condition. Because the collection was received in increments on various dates and initial processing of the collection had begun at an earlier date, no original order could be determined. The collection in its entirety was then processed/reprocessed, with staples removed from documents and images appropriately interleaved with acid-free paper or placed in polypropylene sleeves. Match heads have been removed from matches contained in matchbooks.

Some of the photographs are captioned on the back of the photographs, and some have been professionally produced with identifying information as well as captions on the back of the photographs.

An identification tag has been attached to each individual artifact.

1.25 linear ft. (one record center box) of books originally with the collection have been absorbed by the History of Aviation Collection aviation stacks.
