

DFW LABOR MARKET UPDATE SEPTEMBER 2020



Summary

Job postings in the Dallas-Fort Worth area fell 13% between August and September 2020, 21% below September 2019 job postings. The top-three positions posted were registered nurses, heavy truck drivers, and software developers.

Employment in September remained near August levels for most sectors, with notable increases of 3% in government and 2% in transportation and utilities. While employment in most sectors was down from last year, financial activities employment was 3% higher and mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction employment 4% higher than in September 2019.


Texas and DFW unemployment rates* rose slightly in September, returning to July levels, but nonetheless remained much lower than peak unemployment in April. DFW saw an increase from **6.3%** in August to **7.5%** in September, slightly lower than the national unemployment rate (7.7%). 
