We make it easy for students to get involved at UT Dallas.

Whether you're looking for ways to stay active, express your artistic side or get involved with surrounding communities, opportunities abound.

Competing at the NCAA Division III level, the UT Dallas intercollegiate athletic program is one of the most successful in the American Southwest Conference (ASC).

The Comets have been their most successful in:

BASKETBALL This past year, the women's team claimed a third ASC Championship in five seasons and again hosted the first two rounds of the NCAA Division III national tournament. The men's basketball team, which has also won three ASC championships, has been to the Sweet 16 round of the NCAA Division III national tournament in 2009, 2010 and 2014.

SOCCER The UT Dallas men's team has won the ASC championship four times since 2004, including the past two seasons. The Comet men have now made three straight appearances in the NCAA Division III national tournament, hosting the first two rounds in 2014. The women's team won a title in 2002 and shared the championship in 2004.

VOLLEYBALL In just 13 seasons since the program began in 2004, the UT Dallas volleyball team has qualified for the conference postseason every year, won seven consecutive division titles and back-to-back ASC championships twice (2008-09 and 2015-16).

BASEBALL AND SOFTBALL UT Dallas' baseball program has qualified for the ASC Championship Tournament almost every season and advanced to the NCAA Division III regional playoffs in 2007. In 2017, the softball team won the ASC championship for first time in program history.

TENNIS The UT Dallas men's and women's tennis teams each collected ASC championships in 2013 and both squads advanced to the NCAA Division III national tournament.

CROSS COUNTRY The women's cross country team collected its first-ever ASC championship in 2016 after back-to-back runner-up finishes. The men's squad has placed in the top four at the ASC meet each of the past four seasons, finishing second in 2016.

GOLF The men's golf team claimed the ASC championship in 2003 and has placed in the top five in four of the past five league tournaments. The women's team placed fourth at the ASC championship in 2015.

UT Dallas also has a variety of intramural sports activities as well as over 20 different club programs, including archery, cricket, fencing, rugby and Ultimate Frisbee.

While living on campus is not required for any of our students, we do offer a range of housing options. Incoming freshmen can live in one of our five residence halls — which have all been built since 2009 — in a comfortably furnished three-bedroom style suite. Incoming freshmen also have the opportunity to participate in Living Learning Communities for: Arts and Technology; Computer Science; Engineering; Exploration, for undeclared students interested in different majors and career possibilities; Pre-Health; Social Sciences.
