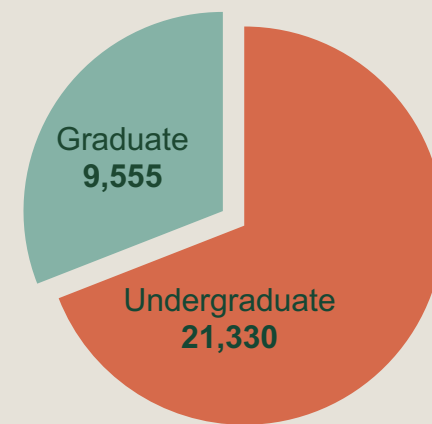
Male / Female

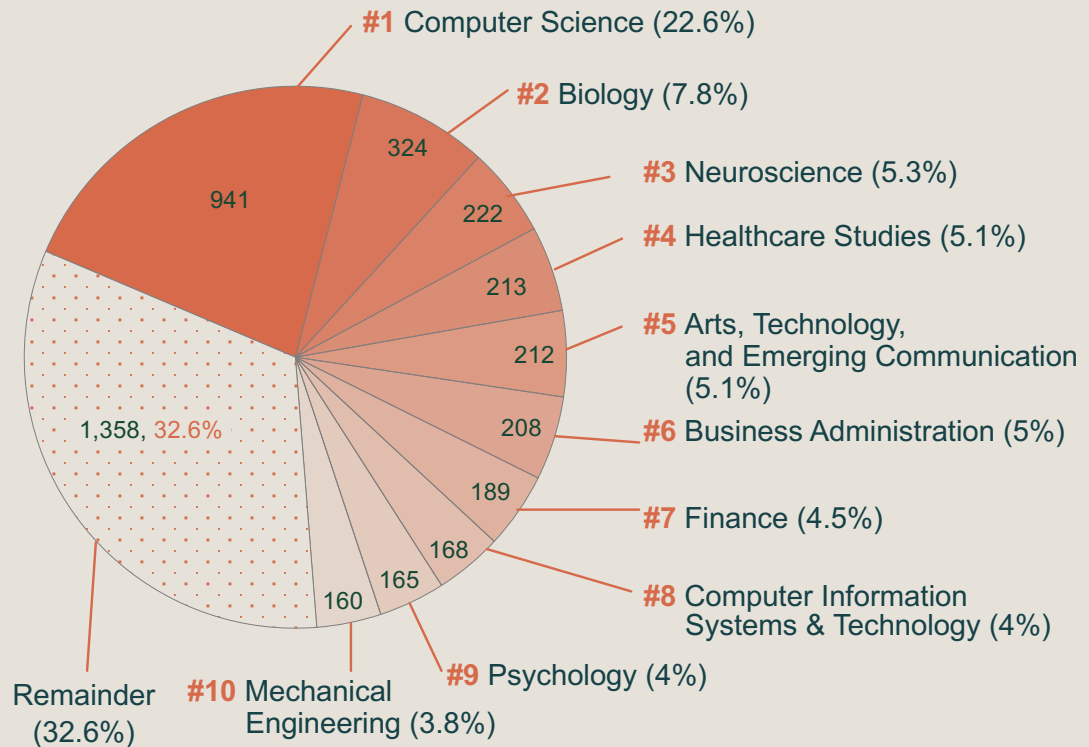

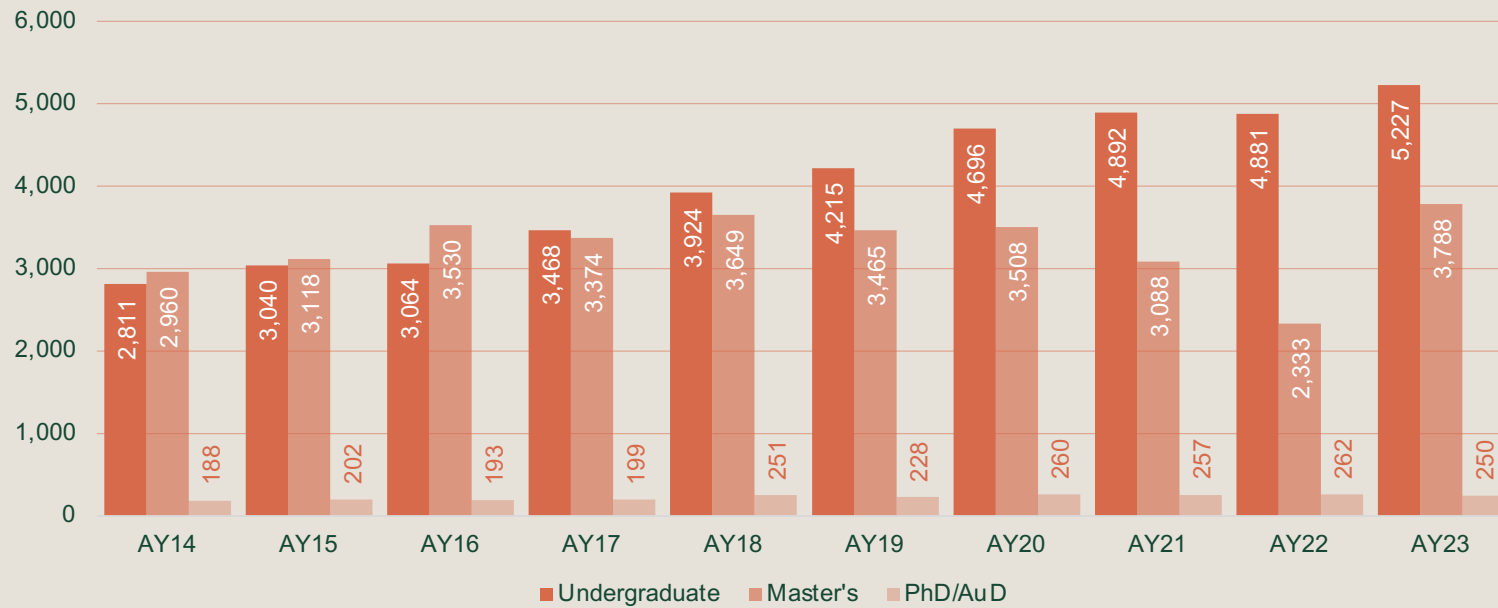

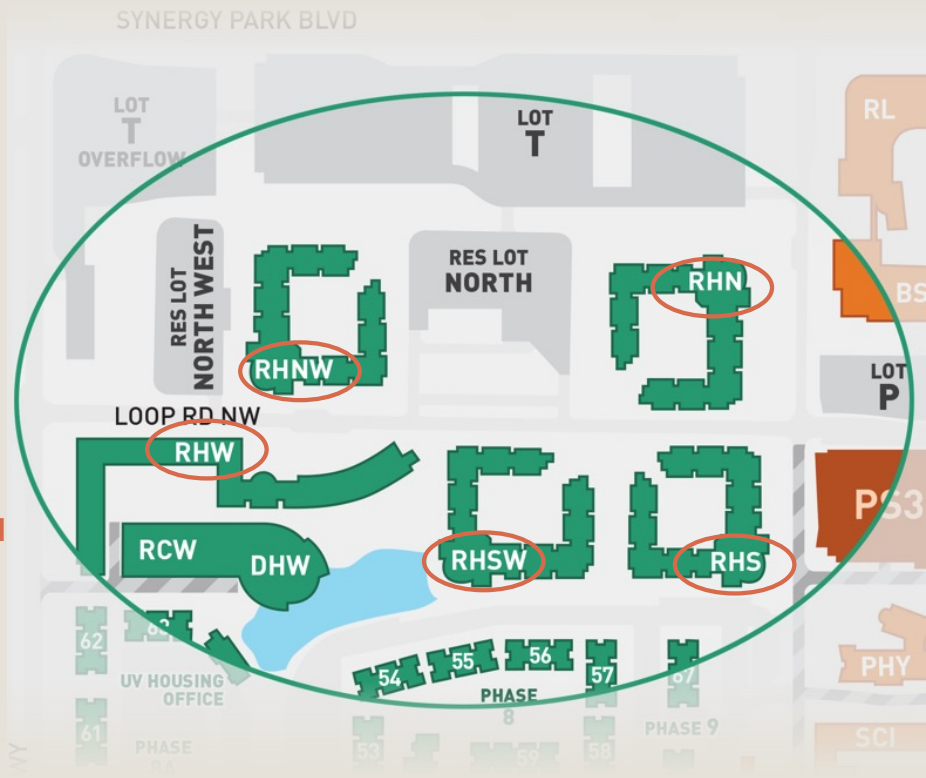
Partnership with UTD, Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Texas and the National Fitness Campaign

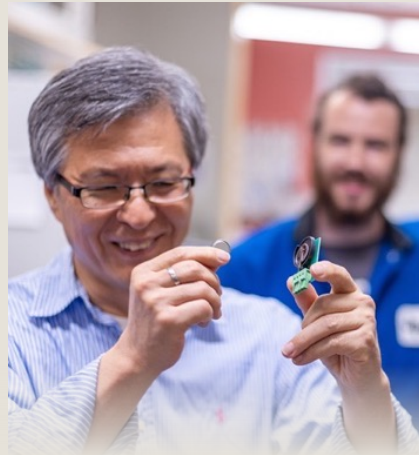

Batteries and Energy to Advance Commercialization and National Security (BEACONS) center

\$30 million awarded by the Department of Defense to establish the BEACONS center.

- Develop and commercialize new battery technologies and manufacturing processes.
- Make raw materials more available.
- Train high-quality workers in the industry.

Office of Research and Innovation

We grow entrepreneurs.

At the 2023 Tech Titans Awards, UTD had five finalists in three categories, with one taking home the trophy.

Institute for Innovation and Entrepreneurship

- 4 startup acquisitions since 2020.
- 3,142 UTD students are involved in startup activities.
- Hosted international conference for Global Consortium of Entrepreneurship Centers.
 - More than 600 attendees from 250+ universities.
 - 23 countries represented.

Office of Technology Commercialization

- 309 currently active patents and 299 patents pending (*13% and 32% increase, respectively*).
- 65 active licenses/options (*7% increase*).
- \$4.8M in license revenue.

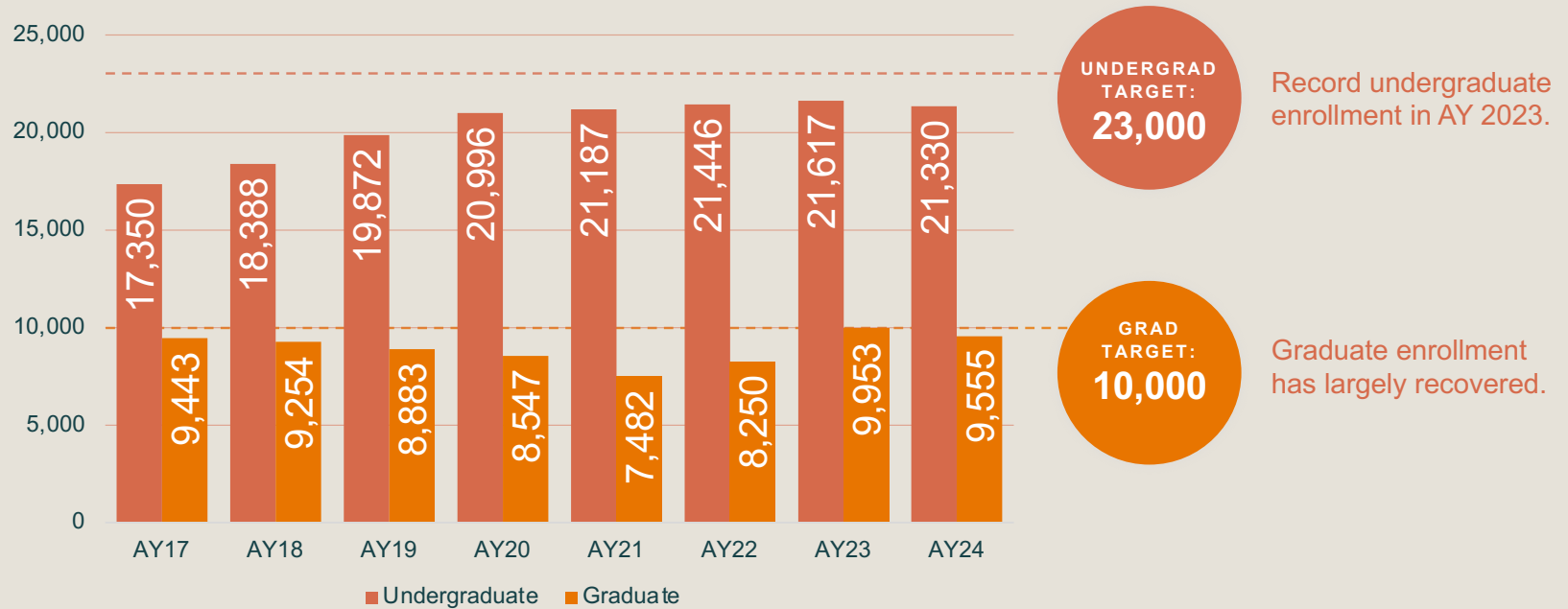

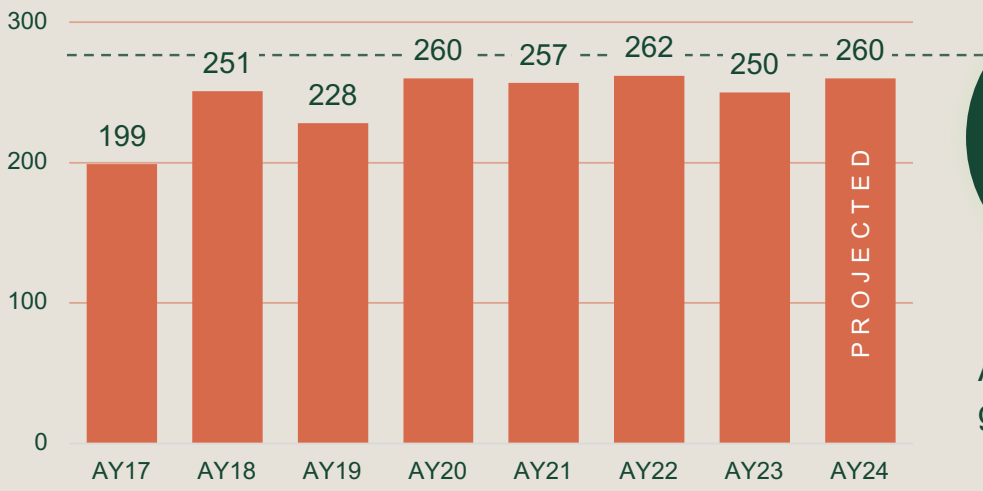

Progress Toward Quantitative Targets for Academic Year 2025

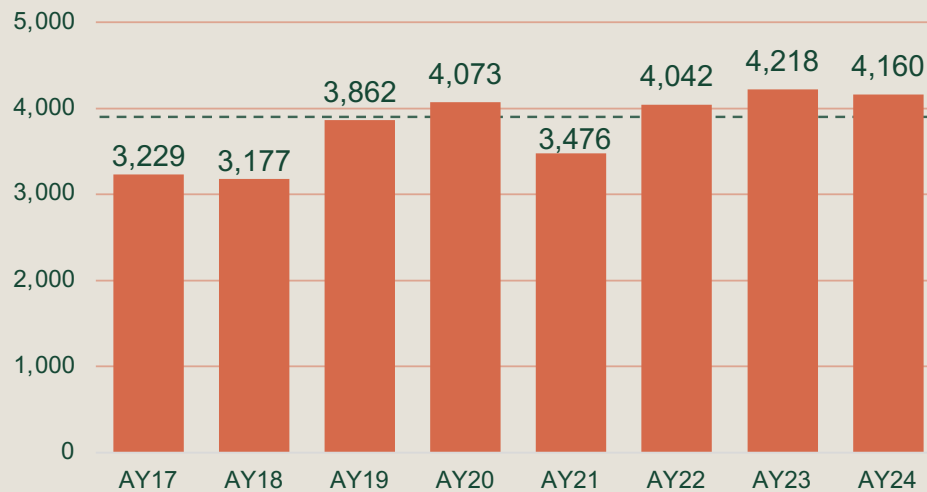

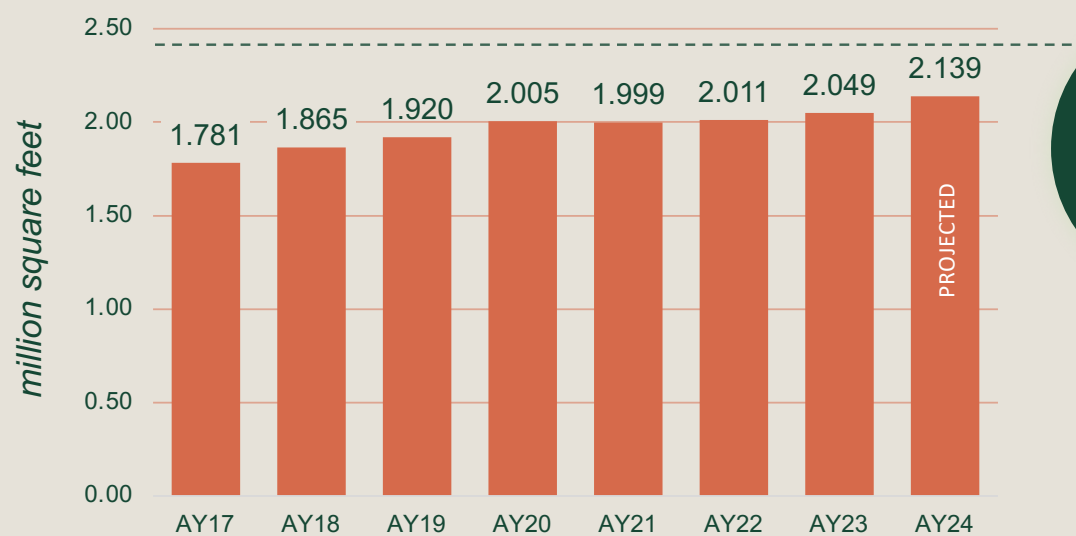

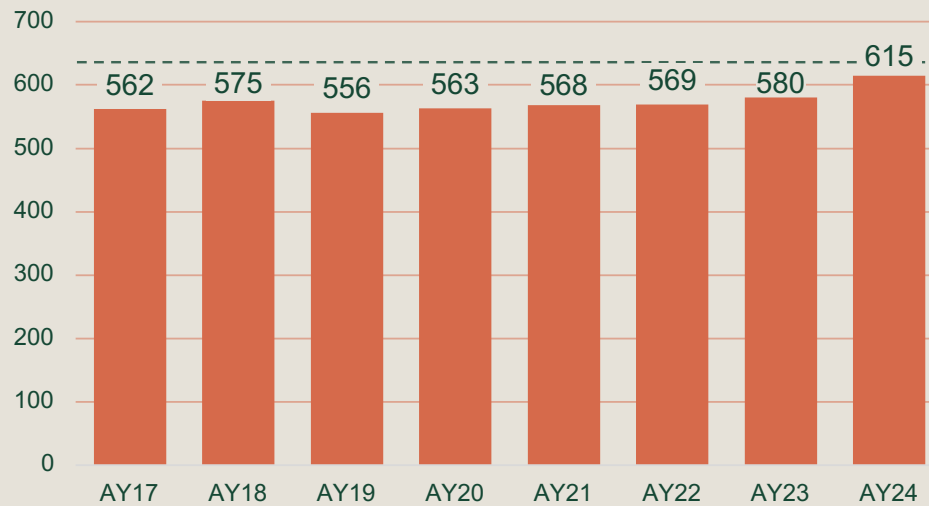

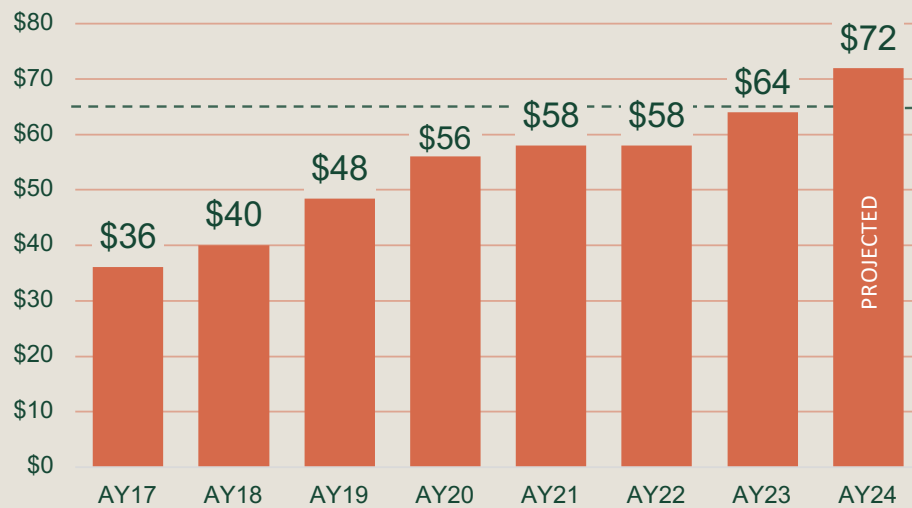

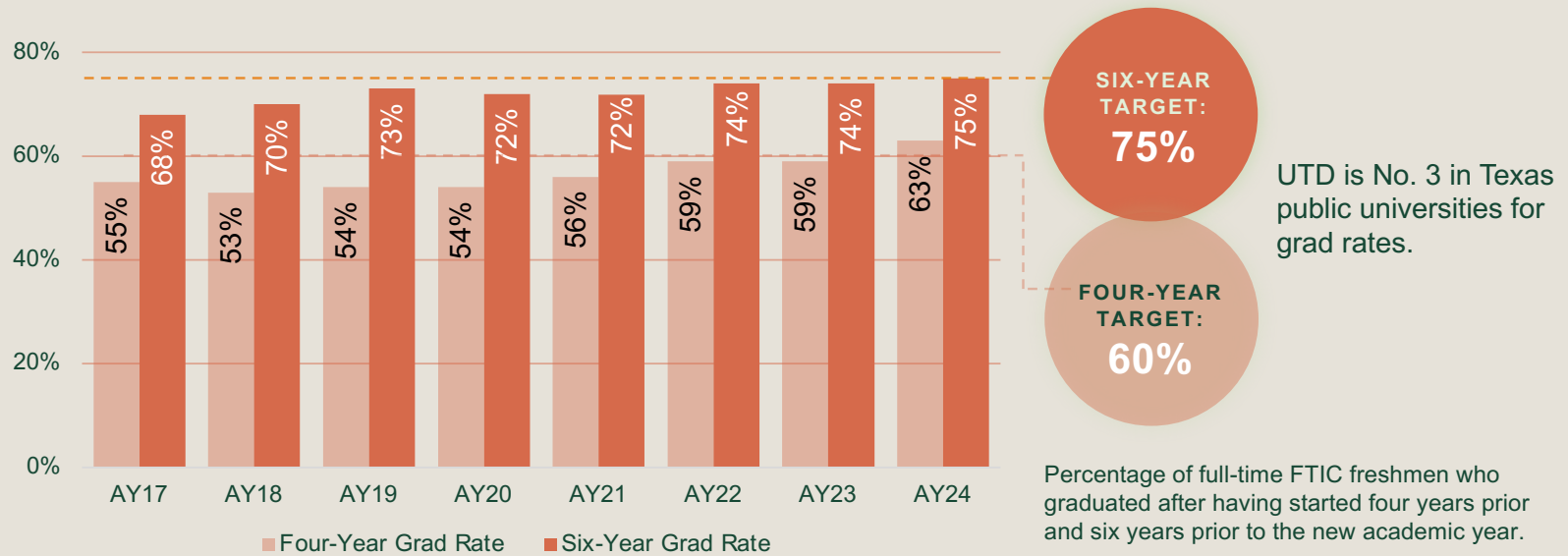

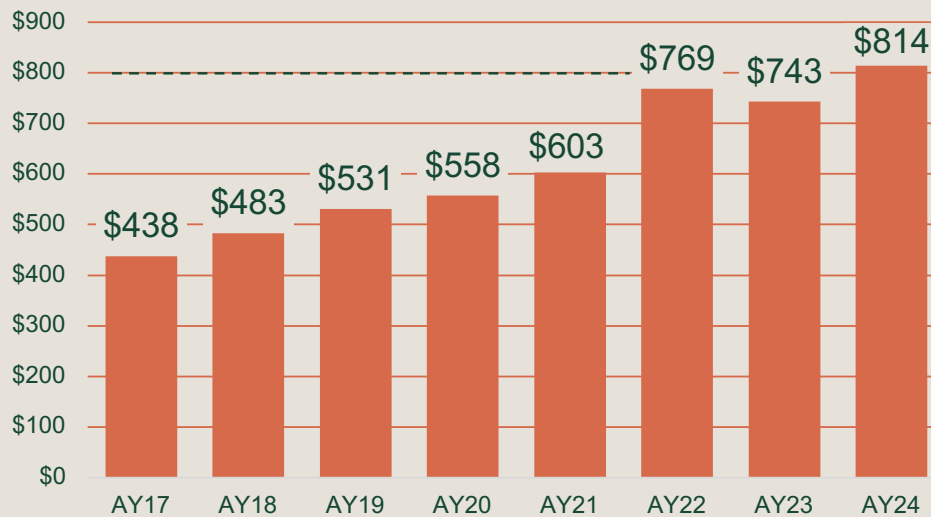

Office of Information Technology

- **Completed** wireless network refresh and expansion.
- **750+** laptops loaned to students in need.
- Added **new group study stations** in the Student Labs.
- Partnered with ISO and Campus IT to **reduce cybercriminal threat**.
- Offered IT forums, training, social media **expansion** to students, staff and faculty.
- More than **100 enhancements** to student and administrative systems.



Budget and Finance



- Finished FY23 with a budget surplus for the third consecutive year.
- Enrollment growth post-COVID and strategic decisions made during COVID significantly strengthened UTD's financial position.
- Improved graduate employee compensation for the second year by providing health insurance in FY23 and salary increases in FY24.
- Three consecutive years of aggressive salary programs designed to offset inflation: Total of 15% for FY22, FY23, FY24.
