The U-17 was the military version of the Cessna 185. An unknown number of U-17s was operated by the Khmer Air Force. Some of them were on loan from the South Vietnamese Air Force.

Cessna U-17	“65-0962” (?)		USAF 65-0962 was not a U-17, but a HC-130H; the real identity of this U-17 is unknown
Cessna U-17A	“65-12912”	185-00966	South Vietnamese Air Force; on loan to the Khmer Air Force at least in 1971/2.
Cessna U-17A	“63015”	185-00597	South Vietnamese Air Force; ex 63-13015; on loan to the Khmer Air Force at least in 1971/2.
